WALES: Hen Wlad fy Nhadau

National Day: 1 March (St. David's Day)

The melody was composed in January 1856 when the composer, an amateur singer and harpist, was still in his early twenties. The words were composed by his father Evan James but the original manuscript shows no harmonisation. The song was first sung at the Llangollen Eisteddfod of 1858. The words and music were first printed in 1860 and the song quickly became known as a Welsh national song, although the official anthem of Wales is that of Great Britain. The anthem is played at all special occasions in Wales and often precedes the British anthem. The title is usually translated as *Land of my Fathers*. The characteristic rhythm in measure 26 is evidently a comparatively modern addition for it does not appear in early editions of the melody.

The first fifteen measures should be played in long sustained phrases. In symphonic band use, trumpets and trombones may be omitted until measure 17, if the woodwind section is large enough. The repeat is usually observed when the anthem is sung as is the *fermata* in measure 25 at the second time.
